Exodus 20:17 (NIV)

1. What is Coveting?

For I would not have known what coveting really was if the law had not said, "You shall not covet."

Romans 7:7 (NIV)

Covet: an inordinate or inappropriate desire for something that belongs to another.

2. Why is Coveting So Dangerous?

But sin, seizing the opportunity afforded by the commandment, produced in me every kind of coveting.

Romans 7:8 (NIV)

 Coveting is dangerous because it hides in the heart, quietly distorts our desires, and leads us into deeper sin.

3. How Can We Overcome Coveting?
